He enlisted in U.S. Navy, at a meeting of the S. O. R. Club an Athletic Association of young men. They were all vols., most of them favored the navy.

After appearing before the medical officer, it was necessary for him to submit to minor operations before he could be accepted into the service, which he did so as to get into the navy, which branch of the service he was anxious to serve in.

He was discharged from the hospital and experienced and told they were not enlisting any more men for that branch of the navy and so after waiting and going back four times they finally accepted him June 12th and went on a three weeks Campy trip with Ed. Brickner to Lakeville Minn. at the end of three weeks returned home and three days later returned to the same Campy with Ed. and stayed another three weeks at the end of another three weeks. a call from the Navy Dept. to report for duty, and on Aug. 1, 1917 reported at Minneapolis and that same night left St. Paul for the Great Lakes, arriving there on Aug. 2 and left in dentention Camp Paul Jones, after being settled in the Company the Company was assigned to the Artillery.

A few days later, or on Sept. 6, received a telegram of the death of his brother Albert and on the same day started for home. Upon arrival home found that his sister Dorothy had also died, following which his sister, Margjone died, all within a few days.

Upon reporting back to Camp found that his Company had left for a three weeks trip on the Lakes. He was then assigned to another Company and due to his previous training with the Artillery he was made a Corporal. Later he was promoted to gun Captain and made out papers on Oct. 2, 1917 for transfer to the Quarter Master School, was in that school five months and three days and was trans-

on Steamer Fenimore and
rode to Yorktown and there
we joined the Atlantic Fleet.
He was assigned to the
Battleship Thainy, the next
day they steamed out of
the harbor for an eight
day cruise. Arrived back
Mar. 24th at Yorktown and
110 boys and 7 officers went
ashore on the 25th. They re-
turned at 9:30 P.M. he saw the
place where Sir Cornwallis
surrendered and where a
large statue is erected.
Mar. 26th we took on provis-
ions getting ready for a
cruise.
Mar. 27th A man went
overboard and he helped
rescue him.
Mar. 28th was put on as helms-
man while the Thainy lay at
anchor.
Mar. 30th Leaving today
got under way at 11:48 P.M.
and dropped hook at 5:50 P.M.

one thousand tons of coal

We found our lodging rather disagreeable but as we expected the voyage to be short made up our minds to bear with it as best we could.

We started late in the evening and made good progress until we entered the Missouri river when we began to run aground on sand bars, and it made but little progress that night, and passed a very disagreeable night of it. Wednesday morning the 30th we succeeded in getting off the sand bar and got started again, but had some trouble with sand bars throughout the day and at nightfall became stuck on another one where we stayed until the next morning.

Wed. Sept. 15th We got off the rocks and started again early in the morning and passed a town named Clinton, Iowa, and Savanah, Ill. in the evening and about midnight we stopped at Dubuque, Iowa where we purchased provisions.

Thurs. Sept. 19th It became foggy towards morning and so the pilot ran ashore until morning. In the evening we passed Prairie Du Chien, Wis. and several small places.

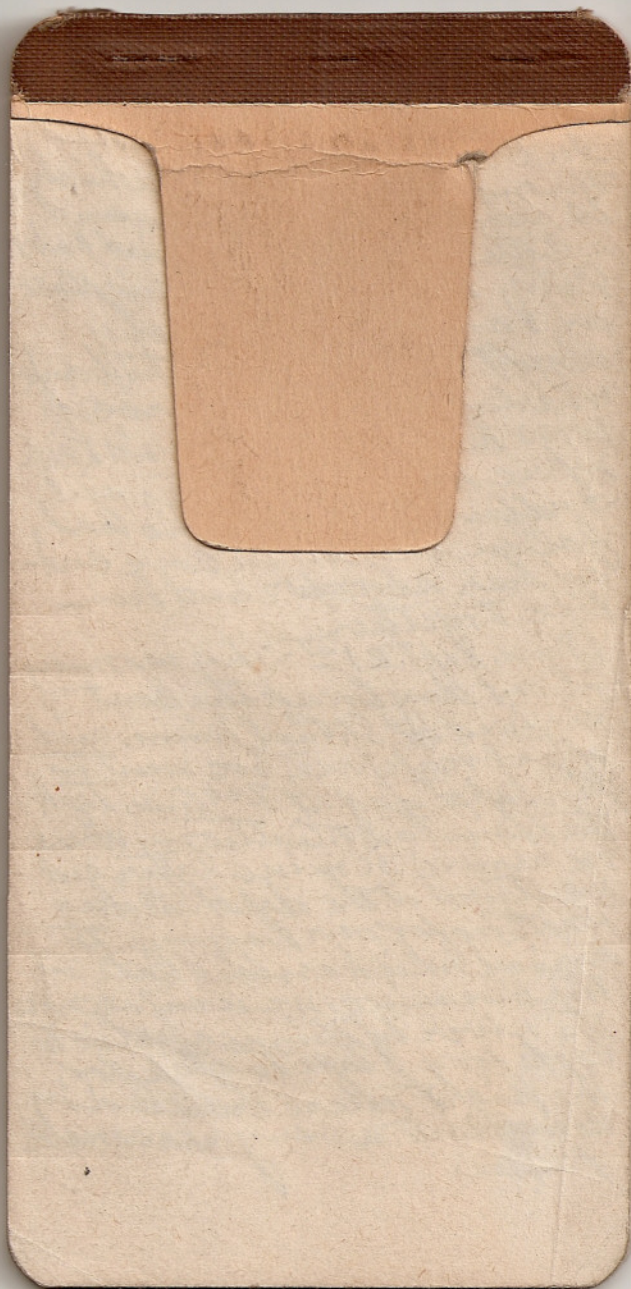
Wed. Sept. 20th We saw some pretty scenery this morning and passed a pretty town in Minn. called Winona.
